



An Industrial Scale Mill Is Proposed for Goodwood

- An industrial scale mill has been proposed just outside the village of Goodwood.
- The company proposing this mill is called Grainboys Holdings Inc. It operates a grain
 processing business called Port Royal Mills located in an industrial park in the Town of Aurora.
- The company wants to move its business to Goodwood where it will build a larger mill on protected Oak Ridges Moraine land.

WHY IS IT A BAD IDEA?

Industrial scale - 18 silos, acre of buildings

Doesn't fit the community - 6 stories high

Noise - 18 hours a day

Dust - harmful PM_{2.5} dust

Truck traffic - 10 tractor trailers a day

Fire Risk - no water and no fire plan

Loss of farmland - protected land lost

Noxious weeds - weeds in imported grains

WHY DOES COUNCIL WANT THIS?

Uxbridge is desperate for more industrial tax base. But farmland is protected by the Oak Ridges Conservation Plan and can't be rezoned. But the company is using a loophole to get around the protection by saying it will buy grains from local farms. But in 28 years it has never bought directly from farmers at its current location in Aurora. Is it just saying it will buy local just to use the loophole?
